New York City's LGBT Community Center has just launched its new virtual art exhibition dubbed the Queer Womxn's Series. In celebration of Pride Month, the first installment features mixed-media portraits by Riya Lerner and Gwen Shockey that showcases lesbian and queer women who have dedicated their lives to creating a safe holding space for women in NYC since the '50s.

Key pieces in the virtual exhibit include a vintage poster from the Identity House's 16th annual women's conference in 1999 and the 1983 book Lady Unique Inclination of the Night, Cycle 6. According

to a press release, additional installments in the Queer Womxn's Series will debut over the next few months. This includes a five-film series in collaboration with Women Make Movies featuring films like The Rest I Make Up and All We've Got, as well as conversations with artists Leilah Babirye and LJ Roberts who will touch upon the topic of lesbian and dyke visibility.
